Pre-Winter Coordination and Preparedness



Pre-Winter Preparations - The SFCJPA team and our member agency colleagues have been coordinating activities to prepare for next winter's rainy season.

Annual Creek Maintenance Walk – We will be identifying and removing hazardous debris.

Invasive and hazardous tree removal plan— This initial plan will focus on the Urban Reach 2 area and will also coordinate with other programs in process by Stanford University in the upper watershed. We are planning to target three invasive tree species: acacia, eucalyptus, and tree-of-heaven. These trees spread rapidly and will out-compete native species, resulting in degraded creek habitat, and potentially contributing to debris jams.

Channel Survey – As soon as the channel is dry enough to safely do this work, Valley Water survey crews will conduct bank and channel LiDAR surveys. The survey information will inform the update of our hydraulic (HEC-RAS) model.

HEC-RAS Model 3rd party evaluation – To ensure the data and assumptions used to build the model are correct, and to confirm the outcomes of the model, we will be retaining consultant services to perform this objective evaluation.

Flood Early Warning System – We are reviewing and assessing existing rain and stream flow gages and potentially adding redundant/additional gages in select locations.

Multi-Agency Coordinating Committee (MAC) – We are coordinating with MAC leadership and members to schedule our regular pre-season meeting and plan for a table-top exercise.

Member City Public Works Teams and Valley Water Coordination – We have set up regular coordination among City public works and Valley Water personnel to ensure we are coordinating our pre-storm preparedness and response action items.

Communications Coordination – We are convening a multi-agency Public Information Officer (PIO) team to ensure we coordinate our community outreach before, during, and after winter storms and any resulting impacts.

Reach 2 Project Update

Reach 2 is the segment of the San Francisquito Creek that passes through the urban area of Palo Alto, Menlo Park and East Palo Alto, upstream of Highway 101.

The Newell Road Bridge - The SFCJPA is supporting the City of Palo Alto's Newell Road Bridge RWQCB permit application. The City of Palo Alto is also coordinating with PG&E and CalTrans. The schedule for Newell Road Bridge construction is expected to be in 2024.

Survey and Hydraulic Model – Survey crews from Valley Water will be conducting a channel and bank-top survey of the creek, starting in August. Also, the hydraulic model (HEC-RAS) used to help us understand and plan for creek flow dynamics will undergo a 3rd party objective review (which will be informed by the results of the survey).

These important action items are expected to be completed by the end of October. Information from these efforts will be used to confirm, or adjust, our planned flood risk mitigation project designs.

SAFER Bay Project Update

October 6, 2023 Tour - Together with several project partners, the SFCJPA will be hosting board members from the San Francisco Bay Restoration Authority (SFBRA) for a tour of the SAFER Bay Project on October 6, 2023.
